

BALLOT TITLE

MODIFIES CERTAIN CRIMINAL SENTENCING LAWS; REPEALS MEDICAL MARIJUANA ACT, REPLACES WITH SUBSIDIZED CANNABINOIDS PRESCRIPTION PROGRAM

RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote increases sentences for specified repeat sex crimes, repeat driving under influence crimes; repeals Medical Marijuana Act, replaces with state- subsidized cannabinoid prescription program.

RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote retains current criminal sentences for specified repeat sex crimes, repeat driving under influence crimes; retains Medical Marijuana Act, rejects subsidized cannabinoid prescription program.

SUMMARY: Current law imposes mandatory minimum sentences of 70 to 100 months for certain sex offenses, does not require mandatory minimum sentence of incarceration for driving

under influence of intoxicants (DUII). Measure requires mandatory minimum 25- year sentence for persons convicted of specified felony sex crimes. Measure requires mandatory minimum 90- day incarceration for persons convicted of two or more DUIIs in previous ten years; state must reimburse county for costs of incarceration.

Repeals Medical Marijuana Act; replaces with state- subsidized program to cover uninsured expenses of prescription cannabinoids, cannabinoid derivatives, and synthetic cannabinoids for persons with debilitating medical condition. Independent medical exam at stat's expense may be required to determine eligibility for program.
